Setting the Scene

• Morgan State fell in dramatic fashion last Thursday night at Hampton. T.J. Mitchell threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to Justin Brown to clinch a thrilling 24-17 overtime victory against the Bears. The Bears were once again led by All-MEAC RB Chad Simpson who posted a game-best 142 yards on 33 carries and scored two touchdowns. MSU's offensive unit racked up 438 total yards, 270 on the ground. MSU will look to get in the win column when take on Bethune-Cookman.

• Bethune-Cookman is coming off a disappointing 38-31 loss at Norfolk State. The Wildcats had two critical turnovers to help Norfolk State walk off the field with the Fish Bowl Classic victory. Bethune-Cookman QB Jimmie Russell led the Cats by completing 8-of-15 passes for 86 yards with a touchdown, and rushing for 100 yards with a TD. Defensively, Ben Ballard collected a team-high eight tackles (7 solo), while Anotnio Cox finished with three tackles and a 42 yard interception return. With the loss the Wildcats dropped to 2-2 overall and 0-2 in the MEAC. Saturday night's contest will mark the 22nd meeting between Morgan State and Bethune-Cookman.

• Wyatt was named as the school's ninth head coach for football back on November 27, 1996 following the retirement of legendary former head coach and current Senior Associate Director of Athletics, Jack "Cy" McClaire. In the process, he was also issued in as the sixth alumnus to take over the Wildcats program--staying with the "All In the Family" attitude at the great Bethune-Cookman University.



• Wyatt's known the highs with a Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) championship, the third in school history, in 2002 with a school-best 11 wins during the season. The wins also included a victory over intra-state rival Florida A&M University in the Walt Disney Florida Classic. That season, Wyatt led the `Cats to their first-ever NCAA Division I-AA Playoff contest, traveling to Georgia Southern. He followed that up with yet another trip to the NCAA I-AA playoff berth in 2003, as well as helping his alma mater to serve as one of eight (8) host sites for the NCAA Playoffs.

• QB Jimmie Russell (Sr./5-9/175/Jonesboro, Ga./Rivedale HS) will be one to watch as the Wildcats prepare for Morgan State this Saturday at Municipal Stadium. Russell is ranked 5th in the MECA in total offense having completed 30-of-61 passes for 358 yards and rushing for 336 yards. Russell has accounted for eight touchdowns so far this season ... he was named MVP of the Fish Bowl as a result of throwing for 86 yards and running for 100 yards in a tough 38-31 loss at Norfolk State last Saturday night.

• The Bears defensive unit will attempt to contain running backs Justin Brannon (Sr./5-10/190/Jacksonville, Fla./Mandarin HS) and Brian Sumlar (Fr./5-11/180/Jacksonville, Fla./Orange Park HS) The duo has combined for 299 yards on 61 carries through four games ... Brannon rushed for 54 yards (4.8) and Sumlar had 52 yards (4.3) and scored a touchdown in last week's loss to the Spartans... Brannon ranks 10th in the MEAC with 177 yards on 33 carries game.

• MSU ballcarriers need to account for All-MEAC First Team safety Bobbie Williams. Williams (Sr., 6-6, 294) leads Bethune-Cookman's defensive secondary ... He has recorded a team-high 17 tackles (15 solo), three breakups and an interception ... He will enter Saturday's contest fresh off of a 7 tackle (6 solo) performance at Norfolk State.

• SEE CHAD RUN ... INTO THE HISTORY BOOKS - Chad Simpson entered the Towson game just needing 63 yards to reach 1,000 yards in his Morgan State career...he ended up rushing for 195 yards! The All-MEAC running back rushed for 142 yards and three touchdowns in the season-opener vs. Savannah State and has increased his career total to 1,495 yards following a game-high 142 yards against #12 Hampton ... **he now sits 16 yards behind T.J. Stallings (1999-02) who ranked #7 in the Bears rushing annals.** As a result of his career-high 221 yard output against the Winston-Salem State Rams in Week 3, Simpson was selected as the MEAC Offensive Player of the Week.

• Donald Hill-Eley is ranked third among the winningest coaches in the history of Morgan State football...behind legendary coaches Eddie P. Hurt and Earl C. Banks. Hill currently has a 26-34 overall record.

• LAST TIME vs. THE CATS - (Sept. 30, 2006) Morgan State's defense kept the Wildcats explosive offense in check and off the scoreboard for three quarters. The Bars defensive unit forced three turnovers, recorded six sacks, and held the "Wyattbone" to just 90 rushing yards. MSU quarterback Mario Melton rushed for a game-high 106 yards, including a 70-yard TD run to help the Bears come away with a 28-14 upset victory over Bethune-Cookman at Hughes Stadium.

- Hill ranks third all-time among MSU coaches with 26 career victories. He passed Morgan State's Clarence Thomas in MSU's 55-26 win over Savannah State in Cleveland Stadium at the Proctor & Gamble Ohio Classic on Sept. 17, 2005.

- Morgan State has produced three All-Americans, over 20 All-MEAC performers, and a MEAC Player of the Year (1) during the Hill-Eley era.

- Hill led the Bears to within one game of finishing with the MEAC Title during his first season at the helm in 2002. • Morgan State held one of the longest unbeaten records in college football as they posted a 54 game unbeaten streak (47 wins & 7 ties) from 1931 to 1938 under head coach Eddie P. Hurt.

- MSU head coach Earl C. Banks held an impressive 31-0 record from 1965-68.

- MSU's last conference championship was won in 1979 under head coach Clarence Thomas.

- Eddie P. Hurt coached and won 14 CIAA Championships; 1930,1932, 1933,1934,1935,1937,1940,1941,1942,1943,1944,1946,1949,1956

- Head coach Earl C. Banks won four CIAA Championships (1962,1965,1967,1968) and one MEAC Championship (1971).

- Morgan State can boast something few other schools in the nation can...four NFL Hall of Famers!!! New York Giant and All-Pro Lineman Roosevelt Brown. Kansas City Chief middle linebacker Willie Lanier, and Cleveland Brown stars Len Ford and Leroy Kelly.

Morgan State enters its 109th season of football, and the sixth under Donald Hill-Eley. The Bears will be host Winston-Salem State on Saturday, Sept. 15 at 4 o'clock in Hughes Stadium. The game will be carried by WEA-88.9FM and streamed LIVE at www.morganstatebears.com.

MSU 2-3 DURING GAME 5's IN THE HILL ERA

MSU head coach Donald Hill-Eley holds an 2-3 record in Game #5 contests. The Bears have squared-off against Bethune-Cookman during the last five seasons.

HOME NUMBERS NOT HALF BAD

MSU has been tough to beat in the friendly confines of renovated Hughes Stadium since the start of the 2001 season. The Bears have gone 12-10 (.545) at home over the last six years.

BEST GAME 5 SHOWING

MSU torched Howard for a 66-7 win in its fifth game of the 1966 season under legendary MSU head coach Earl Banks ... the Bears won the NCAA Atlantic Coast Championship and played in the Tangerine Bowl that same season. Donald Hill-Eley's best fifth game performance was during his second season when the Bears defeated Bethune-Cookman 31-24 in overtime in 2003 during the Cat's Homecoming ... also marking Coach Hill's first victory against Alvin Wyatt.

KEEPING THEM UNDER 20 POINTS

MSU goes into the Winston-Salem State game having held 7 of its last 12 opponents, 5 of which were MEAC foes, to 20 points or less, dating back to early last year. The Bears also recorded its first shutout victory since 2005 when they held North Carolina A&T scoreless in Greensboro at Aggie Stadium and came close by holding Savannah State to just 7 points during the season-opener. MSU held Winston-Salem State to 19 points last Saturday night.

CAMPAIGNING FOR SUCCESS

The Bears enter 2007 looking to post their third winning season, all under Donald Hill-Eley, the most in over 30 years since Earl C. Banks posted 11 straight winning seasons from 1961 To 1971.

BEARS RECOGNIZED

Running back Chad Simpson was selected to the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference's preseason first team, as announced by the league at the annual MEAC Football Press Luncheon Sheraton in Virginia Beach. In 2006, Simpson rushed for 795 yards (5.4 ypc) and scored nine touchdowns to lead the Bears in scoring. Jerrell Guyton (LB,6-0,225,Jr.), Dakarai Grimsley (OL,6-3,330,R-Jr.), Kendell Jackson (DB,6-0,190,Sr.), Roderick Wolfe (WR,6-4,330,R-Jr.), and Rohnie Sykes (TE,6-5,260,Sr.) were selected to the Preseason All-MEAC 2nd Team.

PRESEASON PICKED 6TH

MSU was picked sixth to MEAC Preseason #1 South Carolina State and defending champion #2 Hampton.

SIMPSON FACTOR

Senior running back Chad Simpson, is the real deal. Ever since the South Florida transfer was inserted into the starting lineup against Bethune-Cookman during the 2006 season, Simpson became a name to remember. Simpson enters the 2007 season as a member of the Preseason All-MEAC First Team and will be a strong contender for MEAC Player of the Year consideration. Last season, Chad rushed for 795 yards (5.4 avg) and had touchdown runs of 32, 40, 54 and 60 yards. and ranks 7th in the MEAC in rushing. Simpson was also big asset on special teams where he averaged 16.5 yards as a kick returner. Against Winston-Salem State, Simpson recorded 41 carries for a career-high 221 yards and scored on a 33 yard touchdown run, while last Thursday the senior racked up 142 yards and two touchdowns against #12 Hampton in an overtime loss. MSU will look for Simpson to continue racking up yards when the Bears take on the Wildcats on Bethune-Cookman on Saturday night at Municipal Stadium.

RED-ZONE O

Morgan State will attempt to improve its red-zone figures this season. The Bears are coming off of an '06 season where they ranked 8th in red zone offense by scoring 61.5% inside the 20 yard-line. The Bears seek to get

back to where they were during the '05 season in which they very tough to deal with when they led the MEAC in red-zone scoring offense by scoring 27-of-32 (84.4%) times. The Bears have started off the season red-hot and have converted 14-of-18 (78%) red zone scores, and have scored a touchdown in the end-zone 9-of-18 (50%) times.

INTERNS WANTED

A few members of the Morgan State coaching staff used the summer to gain experience as interns on the professional level. Chennis Berry (offensive coordinator) was assigned to the Detroit Lions where he worked with the running backs, wide receivers and the offensive line; Herbert Parham (assistant head coach/D-Line Coach) worked with the defensive line of the San Diego Chargers; and Simon Gelan (asst. equipment manager) interned with the San Francisco 49ers.

KICKING OFF LIKE THE PROS

Moving kickoffs back from the 35-yard line to the 30-yard line has a number of coaches stressing about their kicking games. An NCAA rules committee recommended the change in the offseason as a way to speed up the game and to add excitement for the fans. And although it might result in more TD returns, coaches worry that it will also increase injuries because there will be more violent collisions during returns.

HILL'S LAST TIME IN MUNICIPAL STADIUM

The last time Coach Hill visited Municipal Stadium was back in 2005 when Morgan State fell to the Wildcats, 44-26.

NON-CONFERENCE GRADE

The Bears are 9-10 in non-conference play under Donald Hill-Eley. The Bears defeated non-conference opponent Savannah State (47-7) and fell to Towson (28-21) at Hughes Stadium.

LIFE WITHOUT ALL-MEAC LB DARIUS LEAK AND STANDOUT DT ROB ARMSTRONG

The only two starters lost from the MEAC's top-ranked run defense is Darius Leak and Robert Armstrong (who was a member of the NFL's supplemental draft). Lamar West, a backup for three of his four seasons, should be a solid starter at Leaks' middle linebacker spot, but it will be interesting to see how much the Bears will miss Armstrong in the trenches. Armstrong demanded a double-team every play and helped free Leak to become one of the MEAC's leading tackler.

DEFENSIVE STOPPERS

Returning linebackers Lamar West, Kofi Nkrumah and Jerrell Guyton combined for 127 tackles, 15 tackles for loss, 12.5 sacks and six forced fumbles in '06. The three LBs combined for 23 tackles last Thursday night against #12 Hampton. Nkrumah recorded a season-high 13 tackles, a sack, interception and a fumble recovery to lead the Bears defensive unit. The Bears currently rank #1 in the MEAC in total defense and scoring defense.

MORGAN STATE CONVERTING ON 3RD DOWN

Morgan State ranked 7th in the MEAC in 3rd down conversions with a .311 success rate. The Bears converted 42-of-135 third down attempts in 2006 after converting a total of 42-of-165 (.364) in 2005. SUPER MARIO BROTHERS

QB Mario Melton will have his choice of talented targets when the Bears line-up for the 2007 season. WR Roderick Wolfe returns as one of the league's top receivers, along with speedster Aaron Moore and dependable receivers Robert Surratt and Terrell White. Returning WR Jai Wilson is expected to wreak havoc as a slot receiver and MEAC pre-season selection Rohnie Sykes will cause match-up problems from his tight end position. Melton completed 7-of-16 passes for 70 yards and ran for a 19 yards. Melton also threw the 13th interception of his career when he was picked off twice by #12 Hampton and was substituted for senior backup QB Byron Selby.

QUARTERBACK CONTROVERSY AFOOT?

Ready for a quarterback controversy? Byron Selby didn't take long to get his feet under him as he almost led the Bears back in their 24-17 overtime loss at Hampton. An interception in the endzone before halftime may have cost the Bears it's first MEAC win of the season, but Selby was a key spark to the Bears putting up 17 unanswered points against the Pirates. Selby's 98 yards passing and 95 yards running performance won't make it any easier for Coach Donald Hill-Eley to stand by Mario Melton his starting quarterback who threw two interceptions before being subbed out for Selby midway in the 2nd quarter. The Bears hope the 438 yard offensive performance against a tough Hampton defense on the road is a sign of things to come.

DEATH PENALTY

Morgan State was the of the most flagged teams during the course of the 2006 season. The Bears ranked No. 9 in the league in penalties (behind Florida A&M) as they garnered 97 penalties for a total loss of 971 yds (88.3/g). The Bears had a penalty-riddled season-opener against Savannah State. The game was marred with 284 penalty yards, 149 against Morgan State. The Bears came up just 7 yards shy of matching last year's season-high of 156 penalty yards posted when they hosted Delaware State on Oct. 15, 2006. The Bears were penalized a season-high 15 times against Winston-Salem State for a whopping 145 yards. The Bears rank as the 2nd most penalized team in the league by averaging 106.8 yards of flags per game.



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TUNING IN

Morgan State University and WEAA 88.9 FM agreed to a year-long broadcast and marketing partnership that will have the local station broadcasting all of the Bears' football games for the upcoming 2007 season. The broadcast and promotional package will also include weekly promotional announcements, on-air ticket giveaways, home contest pre-game shows, and regular broadcast and internet features with head coach Donald Hill-Eley. Listeners in the Baltimore/Washington area can catch each game live on WEAA 88.9 FM, the university's 12,500-watt award winning public radio station. Fans worldwide can listen online by simply logging-on to the station's website at www.weaa.org and clicking the "Listen Live" link on the home page. A link to the live streaming audio can also be found on the MSU athletics site, www.morganstatebears.com. The broadcast team for the 2007 Morgan State Football games will consist of Mr. Robert 'Rob' Long the afternoon sports talk show host on WNST-AM all-sports broadcast radio station, who will serve as the play-by-play announcer and Mr. Kelvin Bridgers, a former Morgan State assistant football coach under current coach Donald Hill-Eley. 2007 will mark the second year as the 'Voice of Morgan Football' for Long and Bridgers.



TOTAL NOTICE 300

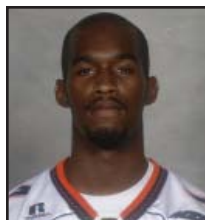
The Bears have posted back-to-back-to-back 300 total yards of offense to open up the 2007 season ... and come off a 400-plus night against #12 Hampton. The Bears offense has recorded 345 total yards against Savannah State in the season-opener, followed by a 375 yard offensive output against Towson and collected 366 yards against Winston-Salem State. The Bears produced a season-high 438 yards at #12 Hampton. The Bears will attempt to once again put up big numbers when they take on a tough Bethune-Cookman defense on Saturday night at Municipal Stadium.

GIANT BEAR

Morgan State former tight end Visanthe Shiancoe joined the NFL's Minnesota Vikings during the summer. The Sheridan Black College All-American was drafted to the New York Giants in the third round of the NFL Draft where he played for four seasons.

LONE WOLFE

Roderick Wolfe's 61-yard touchdown reception (from Mario Melton) against Bethune-Cookman ranked as the longest touchdown catch of his career. This season the Bears expect Wolfe to have an absolute breakout season. The Baltimore native enters the season with 1,056 reception yards and finished off '06 ranked 8th in the MEAC with a career-high 498 yards on 29 receptions with six touchdowns. The 6-4, 195-pounder will also see some action on special teams as a returner as a result of Coach Hill's philosophy this season to "get the ball in the hands of our playmakers." Wolfe was an exciting return specialist for Edmondson HS, and during his first season with the Bears, Wolfe led the team by averaging 20.1 yards on kickoffs, including a



97-yard touchdown. Wolfe enters the season-opener hungry to show the world why he should be a legitimate candidate for postseason honors and a shot at playing in the NFL. Wolfe caught his first touchdown of the season against Savannah State and finished with 5 receptions for 42 yards. He notched five catches and a game-high 64 yards versus Towson and had two touches for 22 yards versus #12 Hampton.

BACK AND READY TO SHINE

One question mark for the Bears during the offseason was 'will Devan James be fit enough to play a full season?' Last year the Bears' freshman RB displayed flashes of brilliance and speed before being sidelined with a season-ending ACL injury. If he's recovered from reconstructive ACL surgery, He wrapped up his short season ranked 4th in the MEAC among kick returners, averaging 24.0 yards per return, including a 51-yarder against Cookman. James will be an absolute threat on the field whether he's running the ball, catching or being used as a returner on special teams. So far this season, James has 21 carries for 89 yards and is averaging 21.2 yards on kickoff returns.

MSU D NUMERO UNO IN THE MEAC

Morgan State's defense ranks No. 1 in the MEAC against the run, total defense and scoring defense. In his second season as the defensive coordinator for the Bears, Alonzo Lee has his Bears defense ranked nationally #13 against the run (87.0/g) and #9 in total defense (266.5/g). The Bears defense returns eight starters along with quality depth and has become one of the premier defenses in the league. The Bears held Savannah State to 140 total yards and 29 rushing yards, limited Towson to 101 yards on the ground, held the Rams of Winston-Salem State to 93 rushing yards and #12 Hampton to 125 rushing yards.

FIRST STARTS

A handful of Bears made their first career start when Savannah State visited Hughes Stadium on August 30th. On offense, left tackle Robert Norris (6-4,315,R-So.), wideout Robert Surratt (6-0,185,So.), and tight end Sean Simmons (6-0,250,R-Fr.) are penciled in on the depth chart. On defense, end Clarence McPherson (6-4,265,Jr.), cornerback Darren McKahn (6-0,185,So.), and safety Gary Albury (6-1,200,R-Fr.).

CONNECTIONS

MSU has 18 players who prepped in Florida, while Bethune-Cookman has absolutely ZERO Maryland natives ... MSU wideout Edwin Baptiste transferred from Bethune-Cookman to play for the Bears.

BEARS LAST GAME: Morgan State seemed to have #12 Hampton (3-0, 3-0 MEAC) hanging on the ring ropes, but it turned out to be the three-time defending MEAC champions who scored the knockout in the end. T.J. Mitchell threw for 253 yards and three touchdowns, including a 30-yard touchdown pass to Justin Brown to clinch a thrilling 24-17 overtime victory against MSU. The game was broadcast by ESPN2 and was definitely "Made for TV" as Hampton played host to a Bear team that had not played at Armstrong Stadium since 2001. The Bears (1-3, 0-1 MEAC) who overcame a 17-point deficit early in the first half, was sparked by the play of senior quarterback **Byron Selby** and a swarming, hard-hitting Bears defense. Selby took over for starter **Mario Melton** in the second quarter and gave the Pirates defense fits with his scrambling ability. The Baltimore product finished the game with 95 yards on the ground and 98 in the air and appeared to energize and give confidence to the Bears offensive unit. With Selby at the helm the Bears took the ball downfield and got on the scoreboard when **James Meade** booted a 43-yard field goal with 6:39 left in the 2nd quarter. It was Meade's second 40-plus yard field goal in two games. **Chad Simpson**, who rushed for a game-high 142 yards on 33 carries, tied the ballgame 17-17 with his second touchdown of the night when he scored from 5 yards out. The TD run capped a 14-play, 64 yard drive with 9:14 left in the 3rd quarter. **Anthony Young** and **Jerrell Guyton** finished with seven tackles apiece to help lead the Bears defensive unit. Senior **Bryan Wilson** was a headache for the Pirates all night as he had a couple of free shots on the Mitchell and finished with six tackles, a sack and a forced fumble, while **Chris Williams** had six tackles and three breakups from his strong safety position.

FAST TIMES

Who's the fastest among the 2007 Bears? It would have to be junior wideout #22 Aaron Moore. The Owings Mills, Md. native was clocked at running a 4.35 40-yard dash. Senior kicker Johnathan Skeete is not far behind Moore ... the 5-11, 185-pounder runs a 4.42, while running back Chad Simpson has been timed at 4.44.

ON D-BLOCK

Senior Dakarai Grimsley has started all four games at left guard this season. The 6-foot-4, 330 pounder is one of the best linemen in the conference and was selected to the 2007 First Team Preseason All-MEAC Team. Affectionately known by his teammates as "D-Block", the New Jersey product has been doing an outstanding job of protecting MSU's quarterback and paving a way for All-MEAC running back Chad Simpson. Simpson has already recorded 700 yards in just 4 games, and a lot of his yards have come on the right side of a line of scrimmage anchored by none other than Grimsley. It's just a matter of time before Grimsley will earn MEAC Player of the Week honors and should be a candidate for postseason honors.

WILL CHAD SIMPSON RUSH FOR 2,000 YARDS???

Nkrumah, Grimsley Selected as MEAC Players of the Week

BALTIMORE, Md. – Morgan State senior linebacker Kofi Nkrumah and offensive tackle Dakarai Grimsley were named as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Defensive and Offensive Player of the Week, according to an announcement by the league office on Monday.

Nkrumah, a 6-1, 220-pound product of Lanham, Md., led Morgan State's defense during the Bears' 24-17 overtime loss to #12 Hampton. Nkrumah registered a season-high 13 tackles (solo), a sack, and recovered a fumble. In addition, Nkrumah recorded an interception in the 2nd quarter against Hampton quarterback T.J. Mitchell.

Nkrumah and the Bears defense held the Pirates scoreless in the second half and limited Hampton to just 125 yards on the ground. Morgan State's defense ranks nationally #13 against the run (87.0/g) and #9 in total defense (266.5/g).

Morgan State junior Dakarai Grimsley played all 89 official snaps in the Bears overtime thriller. "D-Block" is quickly becoming one of the most dominant linemen in the MEAC and took another step at proving it when the Bears took Hampton to the limit.

Grimsley, a product of Elizabeth, N.J., was part of an offensive line that helped the Bears gain a season-best 438 total offensive yards, 270 on the ground. The 6-5, 340 pounder graded out a 98-percent on his assignments and collected four pancake blocks.

Behind an effective line that repeatedly opened holes, the balanced offense produced 25 first downs, and paved the way for All-MEAC running back Chad Simpson who finished the game with 142 yards and two touchdowns.
