#### **Setting the Scene**

The Morgan State football team will look to build upon last week's blowout victory against North Carolina Central when they square-off against Winston-Salem State, the Bears' third consecutive non-conference opponent. Kick-off is slated for 6 p.m. (EST) at Bowman-Gray Stadium on Saturday (Sept. 20) and the game will be streamed LIVE on the internet at Morganstatebears.com. MSU and WSSU will be playing each other for just the second time in the history of the programs.

#### **Quick Hits**

- JR RB Devan James is coming off a game-high 114 yards on 17 carries against North Carolina Central. James has gained 292 yards in two games and currently ranks No. 4 in the FCS in rushing by averaging 146 yards per game.
- SR LB Jarrell Guyton is 25 tackles shy of 200 for his Morgan career, he collected 9 tackles, 2 tackles for loss, a sack and scored on an INT return against the Eagles.
- MSU pressured the Eagles into commiting 7 turnovers (6 INTs. and a fumble)
- Akron transfer Carlton Jackson completed 7-for-14 passes for 96 yards, an interception and a touchdown.
- Keith Lee, who scored his first career TD last week against NCCU, hails from Greensboro, North Carolina and played at Dudley H.S.
- The O-Line, aka. "Trench Mob", helped churn out 247 yards on the ground.
- Sophomore DB Darren McKhan led all defenders with two INTs, including a 49-yard INT return for his first career touchdown.



- LAST GAME OUT Adnan Kljajic's potentially game-tying field goal hit the left upright and bounced harmlessly away as Savannah State handed the Winston-Salem State Rams a 16-13 loss at Bowman Gray Stadium to drop the Rams to 0-2 on the season. WSSU redshirt freshman running back Nic Cooper put on a show for the 5,112 fans in attendance as he tallied a career-high 144 yards rushing and a pair of touchdowns running for positive yardage on all 21 of his carries in the contest.
- Kermit Blount is in his 16th season as the head coach of the WSSU football program. He produced back-to-back conference championships in 1999 and 2000. With 87 career head coaching victories, Blount is on the precipice of history as he heads into the 2008 season poised to become the Rams' all-time leader in career wins. Coach Blount needs only three wins to move past the legendary Bill Hayes as he prepares to rewrite the coaching record book at Winston-Salem State University. Coach Blount has long been associated with football programs that have experienced phenomenal success and he has been a key ingredient in building the success of those programs over the 25 seasons on the bench during his coaching tenure. In all he has been in a leadership role with teams that have won a total of six conference titles at both the NCAA Division I and Division II levels.
- Coach Blount began his coaching career in his home state of Virginia at Armstrong Kennedy High School in Richmond as a quarterbacks coach and assistant offensive coordinator. Following two seasons at the high school level Blount moved on to the collegiate ranks in 1983. In 1983 he became a graduate assistant and assistant quarterbacks coach at East Carolina University where he would begin his collegiate coaching career. Following his stint with the Pirates, Blount moved on to Washington, D.C. and Howard University where he assumed the responsibilities of offensive coordinator from 1984-89 under Bison head coach Willie Jeffries. Soon after his arrival in the nation's capital, Coach Blount's presence was felt as he directed a potent Bison offense to the 1987 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Championship. Following his time in the District of Columbia he spent four more years as part of Jeffries' staff at South Carolina State University (MEAC) in Orangeburg, South Carolina before returning to his alma mater, Winston-Salem State University, as the head football coach in 1993.
- Nic Cooper (6-0,230) will be one to watch as MSU prepares to face the Rams on Saturday at Bowman-Gray Stadium. Cooper had a career-high 144 yards and a pair of touchdowns against the Tigers of Savannah State last Saturday. The redshirt freshman leads the Rams ground attack by averaging 72.5 yards per game.
- MSU's defense will attempt to have success against Winston-Salem State's quarterback tandem. Redshirt freshman Tienne Jefferson (6-1, 200) and junior Jarrett Dunston (6-3, 220) combined to complete 9-of-18 passes for 141 yards with two interceptions in last Saturday's home loss against Savannah State. Jefferson had completed 19-for-32 passes for 239 yards and two interceptions, while Dunston has gone 7-for-12 for 93 yards. Both quarterbacks have yet to throw a touchdown this season.
- MSU ballcarriers need to account for WSSU strong safety Marcus Coates. Coates (6-2, 220) is currently the Rams' leading defender with 15 tackles and 1.5 TFL and a pass breakup. Coates led all defenders last week against Savannah State as he finished with 6 tackles and a tackle behind theline of scrimmage.
- Last week, WSSU's defense held Savannah State to 89 rushing yards on 35 carries (2.5 avg).

# BEARS OPEN 110th SEASON OF FOOTBALL SINCE 1930

Morgan State enters its 110th season of football, and the seventh under Donald Hill-Eley.

#### **MSU-WSSU SERIES**

Winston-Salem State leads the series 1-0 and began the series last year. The Rams upset the Bears last year when Matt Mitchell converted a 24-yard field goal with 4.6 seconds on the clock to give his team thrilling 19-17 win in front of 8,953 fans at Hughes Stadium. The Bears were led by All-MEAC running back Chad Simpson who posted a career-best 221 yards on 41 carries.

# BEARS TRAVEL TO NORTH CAROLINA FOR SATURDAY KICKOFF

The Bears will travel to North Carolina to face Winston-Salem State on Saturday, Sept. 20 at 6 o'clock in Bowman-Gray Stadium. The game will be carried by WEAA-88.9 FM and streamed LIVE at www.morgan-statebears.com.

#### **NON-CONFERENCE GRADE**

The Bears are 10-12 (.454) in non-conference play under Donald Hill-Eley. The Bears bounced back from a loss at Towson by scoring an impressive win against North Carolina Central last Saturday. The Bears have two more non-conference games left on the schedule (Winston-Salem State (9/20) and Rutgers (9/27).

#### **HOME NUMBERS**

MSU has been tough to beat in the friendly confines of renovated Hughes Stadium since the start of the 2001 season. The Bears have gone 15-11 (.682) at home over the last six years.

#### **KEEPING THEM UNDER 20 POINTS**

MSU goes into the Winston-Salem State game having held 11 of its last 24 opponents, 7 of which were MEAC foes, to 20 points or less, dating back to the 2006 season.

#### **CAMPAIGNING FOR SUCCESS**

The Bears enter 2008 looking to post their third winning season, all under Donald Hill-Eley, the most in over 30 years since Earl C. Banks posted 11 straight winning seasons from 1961 To 1971.

#### **NEW FACES**

The Bears have three new coaches on staff. Gary "Flea" Harrell (QBs/WRs/Asst. Special Teams), Jesse Thomas (Kickers) and Justin Weaver (Graduate asst./Asst. Linebackers) were hired in the off-season.

#### **NORTHERN EXPOSURE**



# What is something your fans wouldn't know about you?


"I hate spiders. I'm an arachnophobia!"

#### SIX BEARS NAMED TO PRESEASON | ALL-MEAC TEAMS

Linebacker Jarrell Guyton was selected to the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference's preseason first team, as announced by the league at the annual MEAC Football Press Luncheon Sheraton Waterside in Norfolk, Va. The Bears, who finished 5-6 last season, had six players named to the preseason All-MEAC first team and one named to the second team. Senior offensive lineman Dwayne Delaney, senior linebacker Jarrell Guyton, senior defensive end Clarence McPherson, senior safety Chris Williams and senior kicker James Meade were the first-team selections. Junior offensive lineman Robert Norris was selected to the second team.

#### PRESEASON PICKED 5TH

MSU was picked fifth to MEAC Preseason #1 South Carolina State and defending champion #2 Delaware State.

#### **RED-ZONE O**

For the second consecutive week, Morgan State didn't have much trouble moving the ball into scoring position. But more importantly this time around they put points on the scoreboard in their home-opener against North Carolina Central. The Bears, who ranked 3rd in the league in red-zone scoring last year, finished the night by converting 2-of-4 opportunities inside the 20.

#### **INTERNS WANTED**

A few members of the Morgan State coaching staff used the summer to gain experience as interns on the professional level. Chennis Berry (offensive coordinator) was assigned to the Cleveland Browns where he worked with the offensive line, wide receivers and the running backs; Herbert Parham (assistant head coach/D-Line Coach) worked with the defensive line of the San Diego Chargers.

#### **SLOW START FOR MEADE**

MSU senior kicker and 2008 preseason All-MEAC selection James Meade had another rough game last Saturday night. Meade missed a 31 yard field goal in the 4th quarter against North Carolina Central, and he missed two during the previous week at Towson. One bright spot is that he is 9-for-9 in point after attempts. The Bears coaching staff expects Meade will bounce out of his field goal slump and continue to be a key component to the success of the Bears special teams unit throughout the 2008 season.

#### LIFE WITHOUT ALL-MEAC DE BRYAN WILSON AND STANDOUT LB LAMAR WEST

The only two starters lost from the MEAC's top-ranked defense is Bryan Wilson and Lamar West. Wilson, an All-MEAC First-Team defensive end, was one of the best pass rushers in the league and will be replaced by junior stud Justin Lawrence. West's middle linebacker spot will be occupied by 2008 Preseason All-MEAC linebacker Jarrell Guyton.

# A NEW STARTER AT CORNERBACK FOR THE BEARS

Joseph Ellis, also known as Jody, collected his first interception of his MSU career when the Bears dropped N.C. Central last Saturday night. Ellis, who joined the Bears as a transfer from the University of Illinois Fighting Illini where he played wideout and safety, finished the game with four tackles and a tackle in the backfield. He will be one to watch as the Bears continue the 2008 season.

#### **BEARS SELECT 7 TEAM CAPTAINS**

The following players have been selected as the Bears' team captains for the 2008 season: WR Robert Surratt, QB Carlton Jackson, OG Dwayne Delaney, PK James Meade, LB Troy Leftwich, DE Clarence McPherson and SS Chris Williams.

#### NO AIR SPACE

Last year the Bears' secondary ranked first in the FCS against the pass and returns experienced DBs Darren McKhan, Willie Hardemon and Fighting Illini transfer Jody Ellis. They will be led by senior free safety Chris Williams and strong safety Gary Albury. The Bears currently rank 2nd in the nation (FCS) in interceptions with 7.



#### **HARDY & READY**

Cornerback Willie Hardemon is ready to finish off his career with a bang this season. The senior is determined to prove he is an All-MEAC caliber cornerback and will be a leader of what could be Donald Hill-Eley's best secondary unit since he's been head coach at Morgan State, and quite possibly the best in school history. Hardemon was one of the few defensive backs that came away from the NCCU game without an interception...The Bears recorded six picks!

#### MR. GUYTON

Senior linebacker Jarrell Guyton is top returning tackler in the MEAC. He totaled 124 stops last season and his average of 9.5 per game ranked fourth in the league. He was selected to the preseason All-MEAC First-Team and will be a strong candidate for postseason honors. Last week against North Carolina Central, Guyton collected a game-high nine tackles, with two tackles for loss and a sack. He also scored his first career touchdown when he stepped in front of a pass by Stadford Brown and raced 22 yards for a touchdown.

#### **3RD DOWN SUCCESS**

The MSU offense has been phenomenal at converting third downs in 2008. The Bears ranked 7th nationall by converting 15-of-30 (.500) 3rd downs opportunities. MSU was especially good at converting third downs against Towson. The Bears converted 11-of-17 (64.7 percent) third-down chances against the Tigers in the season opener. MSU is also 3 for 4 in 4th down situations this season.

#### **LAUNDRY SERVICE**

The Bears had another penalty-riddled game. The Bears finished with seven penalties for 90 yards, while the Eagles finished the

game with four penalties for 41 yards. Thru two games, MSU is currently averaging eight penalties for 87.5 yards. MSU was the of the most flagged teams during the course of the 2007 season for the second consecutive season. The Bears ranked No. 9 in the league in penalties (behind South Carolina State) as they garnered 108 penalties for a total loss of 1,120 yds (101.8/g; ranked 5th most in FCS).

#### **POWER POINTS**

In the first three years under Donald Hill-Eley, the Bears averaged 33.3 points per game, by far the most in any three-year stretch in school history. In fact, Hill-coached teams own three of the top five slots in single-season scoring in the modern era of football at Morgan State.

The Bears will look to put up more points than they did in '07, when they ranked 6th in the MEAC by producing 23.7 points per game. MSU is currently aaveraging 32.5 points per game.

#### **GOT A NEW JOB**

Standout center Nathan Soto has bypassed his fifth-year with the Bears in order to take a job with the federal government as a financial analyst. Norris was was an experienced lineman who was expected to be a leader of the Bears offensive line. The 2008 Preseason All-MEAC

Second-Team selection decided not to come back to the team a week before Fall camp opened. As a result of Soto's departure, senior Dwayne Smith (6-2,285) will handle the center duties this season.

#### OB FACTOR

MSU junior Carlton Jackson has turned in two solid outings in his inaugural season as the Bears starting QB. In two starts, Jackson has completed 18-of-30 passes (60 pct.) for 198 yards with two touchdowns and just one interception. That computes to a 130.77 pass efficiency rating. Jackson first MSU start came on the road at Towson, in the Bears'

21-16 loss. He completed 11-of-16 passes for 102 yards, including a touchdown pass to Robert Surratt. Last Saturday, the Akron transfer completed 50 percent of his passes (7-of-14) for 96 yards and hit Edwin Baptiste for a 13 yard TD strike. The coaching staff feels he's very capable of being one of the best quarterbacks in the conference.



#### **TUNING IN**

MSU and WEAA 88.9 FM agreed to a yearlong broadcast and marketing partnership that will have the local station broadcasting all of the Bears' football games for the upcoming 2008 season. Listeners in the Baltimore/Washington area can catch each game live on WEAA 88.9 FM, the University's 12,500-watt award winning public radio station. Fans worldwide can listen online by simply logging-on to the station's website at www.weaa.org and clicking the "Listen Live" link on the home page. A link to the live streaming audio can also be found on the MSU athletics site, www.morganstatebears. com. The broadcast team for the 2008 Morgan State Football games will consist of Mr. Robert 'Rob' Long the afternoon sports talk show host on WNST-AM all-sports broadcast radio station, who will serve as the playby-play announcer and Mr. Kelvin Bridgers, a former Morgan State assistant football coach under current coach Donald Hill-Eley. 2008 will mark the second year as the 'Voice of Morgan Football' for Long and Bridgers.

#### **BACK AND READY TO SHINE**

One guestion mark for the Bears during the offseason was 'who would fill the void left by 2007 MEAC Player of the Year Chad Simpson?' Based on the Bears' last two games, the answer is probably 'YES'. James had a career-night against Towson as he carried the ball 33 times for a gamehigh 178 yards....more than five times better than Towson's rushing total of 32 vards. He followed that performance with 114 yards and a touchdown in limited action against N.C. Central during the Bears home-opener. James will be an absolute threat on the field whether he's running the ball, catching or being used as a returner on special teams. Devan needs just 154 yards to reach 1,000 for his career. He will definitely be one to watch in '08.

#### MSU CONTINUES TO BE ONE OF THE TOP DEFENSES IN THE NATION

Morgan State's defense ranked as one of the top defensive units in the Football Championship Subdivision. In just his second season as MSU's defensive coordinators, Alonzo Lee had his Bears defense ranked atop the MEAC: #1 against the run (130.9/g; #25 in FCS), #1 against the pass (136.1/g; #1 in FCS)and #1 in total defense (267/g; #2 in FCS). The Bears defense returns eight starters along with quality depth and should be one of the premier defenses in the league. So far this season, MSU is nationally ranked No. 6 in rush

defense, No. 6 in turnovers gained, No. 7 in total defense and No. 8 in scoring defense.

#### **DEFENSIVE NOTABLE**

Morgan State gave up 20.5 points per game in 2007, marking the least amount of points they've surrendered since 1979, when the Bears held opponents to 11.5 points per game and pitched two shutouts en route to an MEAC Championship and a Playoff appearance.

#### **PURPLE BEAR**

Morgan State former tight end Visanthe Shiancoe joined the NFL's Minnesota Vikings as a tight end in 2007 and finished the season with 27 receptions for 323 yards and a touchdown. This season, Shiancoe has 4 receptions for 44 yards and the Vikings play the Carolina Panthers on Sunday. The Sheridan Black College All-American was drafted to the New York Giants in the third round of the NFL Draft where he played for four seasons.

#### **PROBLEM CHILD**

Lonnie Harvey will be drawing a crowd this Fall from his defensive tackle spot. Harvey, a 6-3, 345 pound behemoth, will automatically draw at least two blockers on every down. Harvey was the point of attack of last season's No. 2 ranked defense in the FCS. He collected 36 tackles and three sacks in '07, and unfortunately for MSU opponents, he got bigger and stronger during the offseason. With a squat of 555 pounds, Harvey will once again provide the muscle for the Bears' top-ranked defense.

#### **TRENCH MOB**

The Bears may have one of the best offensive lines in the conference. The O-Line, also known as The Trench Mob, is made up of the following players: LT Lawrence Brewer (6-6,295,R-Fr.), LG Robert Norris (6-4,315,Jr.), C Dwayne Smith (6-2,285,Sr.), RG Dwayne Delaney (6-3,320,R-Sr.) and RT Dakarai Grimsley (6-4,340,Sr.). The Trench Mob weighs in at a whopping 1,555 pounds. This group should provide MSU's QBs with plenty of security and open up lanes for the Bears ground attack.

#### **EIGHT OR LESS**

MSU enters the 2008 season as somewhat of a "sleeper cell" in the points or less...two of the losses were in overtime (at Hampton & at S.C. State)...and one loss was due to a mistake on an apparent touchdown (at Delaware State, L 25-17). The ball didn't seem to bounce the Bears way in '07, and they opened the '08 season with another close loss to Towson (21-16).

#### TIME FOR CHANGE

Last year the average college game lasted 3 hours and 21 minutes. Many televised games went well over four hours. Compare that with the NFL timing system where virtually every televised game ends between 2:55 and 3:05. So the NCAA has devised a new system modeled on the NFL system. There are two primary

changes. First, the ready to play signal and 25 second play clock have been eliminated in favor of a running 40 second clock which will begin as soon as each play is whistled dead. Second, when players go out-of-bounds the clock will start on the referees signal as opposed to starting on the snap of the ball. Except for in the final two minutes of each half when the clock will stop until the snap of the next ball. Both of these rules are modeled on the NFL timing rules.

#### SMASH-MOUTH ATTACK

The MSU offense has been a model of consistency as far as running the ball through the first two games of the 2008 season. The Bears have rolled up 743 yards of total offense with 63.5 percent (472 yards) coming on the ground and 36.4 percent (271 yards) through the air. The Bears have rushed for four touchdowns while Carlton Jackson has thrown two scoring strikes. MSU has attempted 38 passes this season, which accounts for 29 percent of the plays run, while running the ball 93 times for the other 70.9 percent of the plays.

#### **BROWNS TO GIANTS**

Cliff Louis, a former MSU offensive tackle and Cleveland Brown, MEAC. All six of the Bears' losses in 2007 were by a total of eight was picked up from waivers by the defending NFL World Champion New York Giants. Louis, a 6-8, 315-pounder with a year of NFL experience under his belt, returns to his native New York where he was born and raised in Brooklyn. Louis, an undrafted free agent from Morgan State, spent all of last season on the Browns' practice squad.

#### SIMPSON UPDATE

Chad Simpson, the 2007 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Player of the Year, was recently placed on the Indianapolis Colts practice squad. Simpson had a sensational career at MSU and became the 4th leading rusher in school history. He started 11 games as senior and was 276-1,402, 14 TDs rushing and 9-201, 1 TD receiving, setting the school's single-season rushing record. He was also was named to American Football Coaches Association Football Championship Subdivision All-America Team. Simpson was signed as an unrestricted free agent by the Colts in May.

#### **BEAR WITH SPOKANE SHOCK**

Kelvin Dickens, a former MSU wideout under coach Donald Hill-Eley, recently played in the Arena Football League's championship game. Dickens, a wideout for the Spokane Shock, caught two touchdown passes but the Tennessee Valley Vipers scored on a two-point conversion to beat the Shock, 56-55 in overtime. Dickens scored on a 13-yard touchdown reception and he caught a 23-yard TD pass on Spokane's opening possession of overtime. Dickens is the No. 3 ranked receiver in school history. He totaled 121 receptions for 2,355 yards and averaged 19.4 yards per catch (2002-05).



TOWSON, Md. – Morgan State held a 16-7 halftime lead against Towson and looked as though they would collect their first win versus the Tigers since 2003.

However their plans were spoiled by failed red-zone opportunities, costly penalties and a quarterback named Sean Schaefer.

Schaefer threw two of his three touchdowns in the 3rd quarter to help Towson pull away from their cross-town rivals 21-16 in the Tigers home opener.

Schaefer was sacked three times and had a Bear breathing down his neck for most of the night; yet he was still able to maintain his poise and connect on 18-of-25 passes for 243 yards, setting a new school record for career passing yards (8.931 vds).

Towson's (1-1) defense pitched a shutout in the second half, despite the standout play of Bear running back Devan James. The junior had a career-night against the Tigers by finishing with 33 carries for 178 yards.

The Bears had a number of scoring opportunities throughout the course of the contest, but it was a 4th quarter play that stands out the most. Morgan State had a chance to take the lead on a 4th and goal from the 1 yard-line. The ball was handed off to James who took flight over the right side of the pile for the apparent go-ahead score. But he was marked just inches shy of the endzone.

The Bears finished the night by scoring in the red-zone 2-of-6 times.

MSU (0-1) was ranked as the 5th most penalized team in 2007, and tonight they were not too far from last year's average. The Bears assisted Towson by being penalized nine times for 85 yards, many times helping to keep Towson's drives alive.

Towson lit up the scoreboard on the fifth play of their first possession when Schaefer hit Casey Cegles for a 55-yard touchdown. Mark Bencivengo's extra point put the Tigers up 7-0 with 12:51 left in the 1st quarter.

The Bears took the ensuing possession and marched 57-yards and stalled out deep within Towson territory. MSU's Carlton Jackson was stuffed on a QB keeper on a 3rd and goal from the four yard line. James Meade's 20 yard field goal attempt ricocheted off the left field goal post, squandering what would turn into several scoring opportunities.

Jackson, an Akron transfer, was efficient in his MSU debut as he completed 11-of-16 passes for 102 yards and ran for 46 yards.

Morgan ended the half with an impressive 15-play, 80-yard drive that consumed over seven minutes and was capped by fullback Justin Lawrence plowing into the endzone from one-yard away. Meade's extra point gave the Bears a 16-7 halftime lead.

Towson began to get an offensive rhythm from the opening moments of the second half. The Tigers put together a 5 play, 54-yard drive and Schaefer threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Steve Holmes. Bencivengo's point after attempt cut Morgan's lead to 16-14 with 11:55 remaining in the 3rd quarter.

The Tigers continued to look sharp and took a 21-16 lead seven minutes later when Schaefer threw a four-yard strike to Marcus Lee for a touchdown that ended an 80-yard, 10-play drive.

BALTIMORE, Md. – Devan James rushed for 114 yards and touchdown and Morgan State collected a school record six interceptions, three returned for touchdowns, en route to a 49-7 win over North Carolina Central on Saturday at Hughes Stadium.

MSU (1-1, 0-0 MEAC) won their fourth consecutive

home-opener and collected their largest victory since a 42-point win against UMES in 1976. The win improved MSU's record against the Eagles to 21-12-2 and it also marked the first win against the NCCU since their last matchup in 1982.

James accounted for 178 yards against Towson last week, and went into halftime tonight with 115 yards on 14 carries, including the Bears first score of the night on a 6-yard run.

The Bears held a commanding 35-0 lead at halftime thanks to a 28-point explosion in the 2nd quarter. Keith Lee opened up the scoring in the 2nd quarter when he took a handoff and raced 23 yards to the endzone. James Meade's extra point gave the Bears a 14-0 lead at the 9:09 mark.

On the second play of the Eagles next possession, Jeff Toliver was hit by Danny Evans and fumbled the ball, and MSU's Troy Leftwich pounced on it at the NCCU 28. Aaron Moore scored on a 28-yard end around (8:18); Carton Jackson connected with Edwin Baptiste for a 13-yard score (:29); and Darren McKhan scored on a 49-yard interception return (:13) to give the Bears a commanding 35-0 lead at the break.

McKhan collected two of the Bears six interceptions as the Bears totaled 165 interception return yards, compared to only 156 passing yards by NCCU.

MSU's defense held Eagle quarterback Stadford Brown to 12-of-26 passing for 137 yards and five interceptions. The defense also limited NCCU to just 67 yards on 39 carries (1.7/ypc).

The Eagles (0-3) offensive unit was outscored by MSU's defense 14-7 in the 2nd half. Jarrell Guyton returned an errant throw by Brown for a 22-yard touchdown return in the 3rd quarter. NCCU finally got on the scoreboard early in the 4th quarter when Brown found a wide open Will Scott for a 22-yard scoring play to end the Bears bid at their first shutout at Hughes Stadium since

MSU defensive back Rodney Etienne stepped in front of Eagle backup quarterback Keon Williams for a dazzling 60-yard touchdown to cap the game.

Jackson finished the game 7-of-14 for 96 yards a touchdown. Baptiste caught four passes for 29 yards while Lee had 12 carries for 74 yards and a touchdown.

The Bears racked-up 369 yards of total offense, including 247 yards on the ground. NCCU finished with 223 total yards and was limited to just 67 rushing yards.

MSU's defensive was led by Guyton who amassed nine tackles, two tackles for losses and a sack. Chris Williams had five tackles and a pass breakup, while Clarence McPherson and Fred Davis each had sacks.

of two touchdowns on the evening with a 15-yard run over left end that gave the Rams the early lead 7-0. His second tally of the game put the Rams ahead 13-9 at the 2:37 mark of the third quarter when he powered his way into the endzone from 23 yards out.

Despite the production from Cooper, the Rams fell short in the game as 342 yards of total offense netted WSSU only 13 points.

#### **HISTORICAL CONNECTION**

Clarence "Big House" Gaines was a legendary coaching figure and native of Paducah, Ky. Gaines retired in 1993 as the all-time winningest Division II coach with 828 victories over a record 47 years at Winston-Salem State University. He compiled 18 20-win seasons and captured the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association title 12 times. In 1967, the Rams went 31-1 and captured the NCAA basketball title. He was named the NCAA college division Coach of the Year that season. It was at Morgan State that Gaines got his nickname "Big House": a student saw saw the 6 ft. 3in., 265lb Gaines and declared: "You're as big as a house." Gaines played as a lineman for the Bears football team, was a member of the basketball team, and participated in track. Gaines was an All-CIAA selection as a lineman in football all four seasons and twice elected an All-American. When it came to basketball, he described himself as "a very average basketball player." Gaines graduated from Morgan State in 1945 with a Bachelor's of Science in Chemistry. He intended to go on into dental school, however his college football coach, Eddie Hurt, suggested that he temporarily go to what was then known as Winston-Salem Teachers College. At the time, the small southern college had one coach for all sports, Brutus Wilson, who as also a Morgan State graduate; Hurt suggested that Gaines would make a good assistant coach. Gaines agreed and went to Winston-Salem.


